Dustbins were strategically placed near the hostels, adjacent to the classroom complex, and around Pakshi Vihar to address litter accumulation effectively.

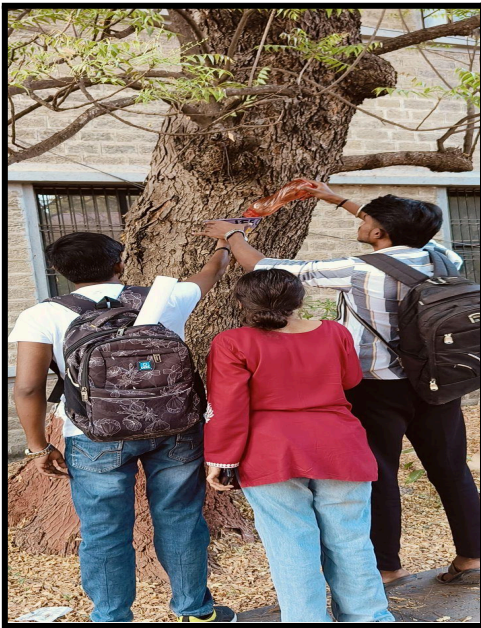
The primary objective was to cultivate environmental consciousness among students, faculty, and staff while minimizing littering and contributing to a cleaner campus environment.
